Dean T. Howell Biography

Dean T. Howell is a member in the firm whose practice is focused primarily on civil litigation. As part of his practice, Mr. Howell has defended national oil and petrochemical companies in toxic tort cases in Tennessee, North Carolina, Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, Kentucky, Ohio, and West Virginia. He has participated in defense teams in litigation involving exposure to naturally-occurring radioactive materials (“NORM”). He has also been involved in the development of expert evidence based on genomic and toxicogenomic testing and evidence in defending clients against allegations of exposure to NORM. The most recent trial in which this genomic and toxicogenomic evidence was used resulted in a defense verdict in August 2013.

Mr. Howell was born in Morristown, Tennessee. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa from The University of

Tennessee in 1999 with a B.A. in history. Mr. Howell obtained his J.D., *magna cum laude*, from Washington and Lee University School of Law in Lexington, Virginia, in 2002. He is licensed to practice law in the state of Tennessee and the Commonwealth of Kentucky and has defended clients in toxic tort cases in Tennessee, North Carolina, Florida, Mississippi, Kentucky, Ohio, and West Virginia.
